We're pleased to share that RugbyConnect, operated on the SportLoMo platform, has been recognised as **"an excellent addition to the reporting and management of domestic rugby in Ireland"** by an independent audit conducted by KOSI Corporation on behalf of Sport Ireland.

The audit, carried out on the Irish Rugby Football Union (IRFU) in 2024, highlighted the platform's ability to link every club and province while capturing essential data on games, players, competitions, coaching, vetting, and education.

RugbyConnect is the dedicated name for the SportLoMo system used by the IRFU. The platform is utilised by the provincial rugby bodies of Leinster, Munster, Ulster, and Connacht, as well as every rugby club across Ireland. It serves as the central hub for managing all the domestic rugby operations in the country.

Following the Sport Ireland Audit, at a meeting in SportLoMo's headquarters in Mayo, IRFU's Director of Rugby Development, Colin McEntee, and Head of Rugby Development, Ultan O'Callaghan, expressed their appreciation for the positive feedback received from KOSI and Sport Ireland. The SportLoMo team is encouraged by this recognition and remains committed to continuously enhancing the platform to serve the needs of the IRFU and rugby worldwide.

Sport Ireland is a government agency tasked with overseeing good governance in Ireland's National Sports Governing Bodies (NGBs). The agency recognises 60 NGB's in Ireland and it provides funding and support to the majority of these NGB's on behalf of the Irish Government.
